Downhill Ski and Snowboard Trip

With over 300 inches of average annual snowfall, 300 days of sunshine and more than 1,200 skiable acres, Taos Ski Valley offers a relaxed, friendly atmosphere, breathtaking scenery and exhilarating terrain for every ability level and a spirited mountain experience unlike any other. The Village of Taos Ski Valley is located at the southern end of the Rocky Mountains in the rugged Sangre de Cristo Mountains, 18 miles northeast of the Town of Taos. Originally settled by a group of hearty and adventurous miners in the 1800's, the community is now inhabited by intrepid skiers and outdoor enthusiasts year-round. Explore the history of the Wild West and the adventure that awaits you today in Taos Ski Valley.

Nestled among the pristine peaks of northern New Mexico, Taos is a unique blend of the Swiss-German founders vision of a European atmosphere combined with the local Native American and Spanish cultures. Old world ambience seasoned with Native American and Spanish spice gives Taos Ski valley its unique flavour and dining experiences. The village is surrounded by Carson National Forest. Taos Ski Valley has adapted over the years so that its fabled wall of steep elevator –shaft chutes are complemented by beginner and intermediate runs on almost 50% of the terrain and is a mixture of bowls, bumps, and glades. The mountain towers over a mile above brilliant New Mexico desert and the 800 year old pueblo of the Taos Indians. The contrasting local cultures – Native American, Hispanic and Anglo – have always thought of the mountains differently. It is said by some Indians that the snow-capped peaks are the breasts of the god who created them. The Spanish padres rejected that belief and renamed the mountains the Sangre de Cristo – Blood of Christ – because of the brilliant sunsets that painted the summits red. The skiing starts at 9200 feet and rises in a turquoise sky to 12,451 feet in the heights of Kachina Peak, which is accessed by a new chairlift.

Snakedance condos are located slope-side, less than 20 yards from Lift #1, high speed quad and the main access point to the mountain, in the center of the base area. It is walking distance to shops and restaurants. A trip to historic downtown Taos is included along with a complimentary dinner at the General Manager's residence.

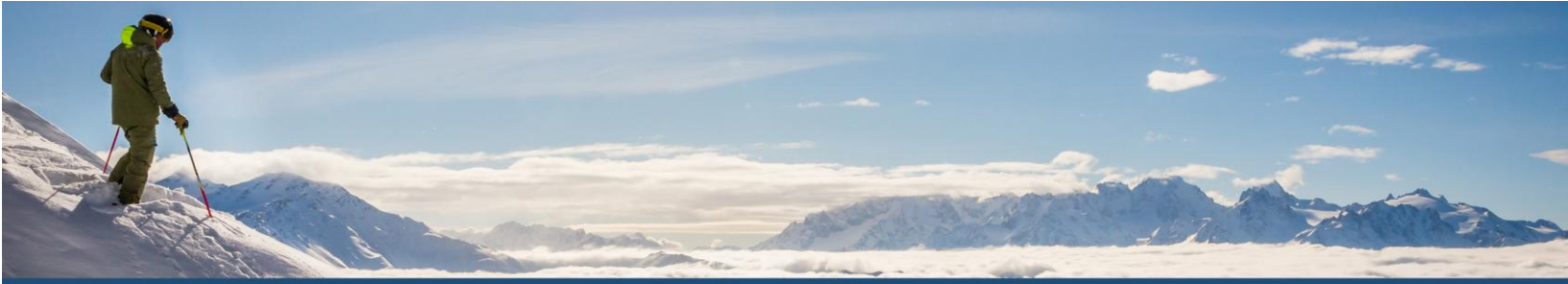

What's included

Accommodation

The Snakedance condominiums are located slope-side, less than 20 yards from the main access point for the mountain, in the center of the base area, walking distance to shops and restaurants. The on-site amenities include an indoor hot tub and dry sauna and ski storage.

The standard two bedroom condominiums offer spacious rooms and comfortable décor. Each unit has a gas fireplace with French doors opening onto a Juliet balcony, and a fully equipped kitchen. Bedrooms have split king beds and the unit has two full washrooms. Based upon double occupancy, 4 people per condo in a 2 bedroom condo.

Meals

Lift Tickets

5 day lift pass for Taos Ski Valley

- ❄ Senior 5 Day (age 65-79): Deduct \$100
- ❄ Senior 6 Day – same price as Adult 5 day
- ❄ Adult 6 Day: Add \$115
- ❄ Super seniors (age 80 and older) ski for free: Deduct \$500
- ❄ No Lifts: Deduct \$500 (includes IKON pass holders)
- ❄ 6 Day option cannot be sold to IKON pass holders

Other Options

- ❄ Single Room will be Triple Occupancy (your own room, sharing a 2 bedroom condo): Add \$425.
- ❄ Land Only: Deduct \$700. The transfer bus will not wait for passengers who are arranging their own air travel. No discount will be given for missed transfers and those passengers must make their own arrangements to get to the resort.

Taos Ski Valley offers 110 runs:

- 51% advanced
- Above these slopes are the challenging double diamond chutes of the highline and west basin ridges
- Base elevation 9,206 feet, peak elevation 11,819 feet with ultimate elevation at Kachina Peak 12,481 feet
- 1,200 skiable acres

Passport / Travel Documents

Canadian citizens need a Canadian passport that is valid until at least 6 months after the scheduled return date. Other nationalities may require different documents. It is necessary for such people to advise their nationality at the time of booking so that we can determine what travel documents they will require in order to participate in this trip. For all nationalities, please note that entry to another country may be refused even if the required information and travel documents are complete.

Note: Members are solely responsible to ensure that their travel documents are complete, valid and in order.

Cancellation Policy

Cancellation Policies are set by the Tour Operators, not HPSC. Please consider your commitment carefully before booking your trip.

- ❄ Deposits and Insurance Premium are non-refundable.
- ❄ Single Supplement charge is non-refundable unless a substitute is found.
- ❄ From December 11 to departure, total holiday cost is non-refundable.

Insurance is non-refundable from date of issuance. Please note that any unused portion of a ski trip will not be refunded as per conditions above. Passengers must submit a claim to their insurance company if they cancel after the above dates.

Individuals must ensure that all names are spelled correctly and match their personal identification on their passport.
