Downhill Ski and Snowboard Trip

Jay Peak in Vermont's Green Mountains, is home to some of the East's best terrain providing skiers and riders with amazing tree glades, long, groomed trails, and abundant natural snow averaging 359" annually. Jay Peak boasts the highest average annual snowfall on the East Coast, and some of the best skiing and snowboarding in Vermont with steep, great trees, and plenty of powder. With 385 acres of terrain, and 100+ gladed acres, Jay Peak has a vertical drop of 2,153' and the trees are pure fun. The ski area contains a large snow-making infrastructure which covers over 80% of the resort.

There are two main parts of the mountain, Tramside and Stateside, each with their own base area. We are staying ski-in ski-out in the Stateside area. For advanced skiers and snowboarders the Jay Peak Aerial Tram is an awesome place to start. While lift lines aren't a huge problem here, make sure to show up nice and early on a powder day.

This is the first time this trip has been run at HPSC in over a decade, so be forewarned, it will likely sell out quickly.

Sunday, March 13, 2022 – Thursday, March 17, 2022

What does it cost

\$1,040.00 – Condo with 4 persons (2 bdrm: 1Q + split king). Includes dinner.

\$1,235.00 – Hotel room, single occupancy (2Q or 1K). Includes breakfast and dinner.

Trip Highlights

- ❄ 4 days of magnificent skiing on 385 acres of skiable terrain, including 81 trails and, 4 terrain parks (new), accessed by 9 lifts including Vermont's only aerial tramway (60 person capacity).

What's included

Accommodation Options

1. **Timberline Cottages: 2 BR condo, (2Q, or split king combo).**



The Timberline Condominiums are among the newest lodging options on the mountain. Condos are located on the Grammy Jay run and steps away from the Stateside Hotel, site of the pool and hot tub and dining facilities. The 2 bedroom units include a full kitchen with granite countertops and bathroom for each bedroom in the unit. Included: stackable washer and dryer, Internet, Toiletries, Towels/Linens.

On the first day there will be a grocery run into town to purchase food and refreshments that you might want for the rest of the trip.





2. Stateside Hotel, (2Q or one King).



The recently completed 85-room Stateside Hotel & Baselodge offers skiers and riders ski-in, ski-out access to Stateside and a number of amenities. Rooms offer comfortable beds, bathrooms, mini refrigerator, and mountain or valley views. With access to good food, drink at Howie's Restaurant & Bar, The Bullwheel Bar, Stateside Baselodge and The Gear Shop. Included: Internet, Microwave, Mini Fridge, Toiletries, Towels/Linens.

Meals

The Hotel option includes both hot breakfasts and dinners. Condos handle their own breakfasts but join up for dinner at the Stateside dining room. All meals are served at the Stateside Hotel Dining room buffet style. You will pre-choose your dinner entrée, have a choice of salad or soup, a choice of starch, seasonal vegetables, and one choice of dessert. Entrées will include: grilled flank steak, chicken in pomegranate molasses, pasta primavera, roasted turkey breast, salmon, and pork tenderloin. A grocery and liquid refreshments run will be scheduled after the first day of skiing.

Departure

On Sunday March 13, 2022 from Yonge & York Mills, Toronto at 9:30 am and 10:00 am from Scarborough.

On Thursday March 17, 2022 from Jay Peak at 3:00 pm.

Transportation

To the ski area and return will be by HPSC luxury coach.

What you should know and fine print

Thrilling Trip

Jay is known for its copious snow and liberal in-bounds policy that ensures you can enjoy all 81 trails, slopes and glades - nooks and crannies included. Skiing here is all about getting off the beaten track. From the top of the tram, drop into the Face Chutes, which the Tram passes directly over. The steep open face with lots of drops is unique on the East Coast. From the bottom of the chutes, head towards the top on the Bonaventure Quad to find some of the





best trees on the mountain, Vertigo and Deliverance are memorable. Later in the day, lapping here on the Bonaventure (Bonnie), chair, and the Jet Triple are fun, and avoid the Tram Line.

Intermediate skiers and snowboarders can ride from the top of the Tram, sticking skier's right on Vermonter, or skier's left on Northway. Following Northway all the way to the Stateside base is a nice long run, with access to more intermediate terrain off the Bonaventure Quad.

While powder skiing and snowboarding are the forte at Jay Peak, novices have a lot of great options, too. Near both base areas there are multiple options to choose from. The Taxi Quad and Metro Quad are great options for fast laps. Having a combination of hotel and condo accommodation provides flexibility and convenience for the condos to enjoy breakfast at home. The accommodations are relatively new and are all up to date.

Passport / Travel Documents

A valid passport is required for this US destination. A Visa may also be required if you are not a Canadian or US citizen. It is your responsibility to have proper travel documents on your person before the trip departs. Anyone who is not admitted to the United States will have to provide their own return transportation from the border.

Optional Travel Insurance

For overnight bus trips, members are responsible for arranging their own trip cancellation insurance and medical insurance. On USA trips, Out-of-Country health coverage in case of sickness or injury is **strongly recommended**. Insurance can be purchased from a number of Toronto sources. Some credit cards also provide coverage but check carefully that it will apply to your trip. All insurance claims must be made by the member to their own insurance company. In the event that the US/CAD border is not open all trip costs will be fully refunded.

COVID regulations can change at any time and compliance with them is the responsibility of each member. Members should be cognizant of COVID related regulations as they may be advised in the provincial, federal, US and resort websites at all times and particularly in the days/weeks just prior to departure.
